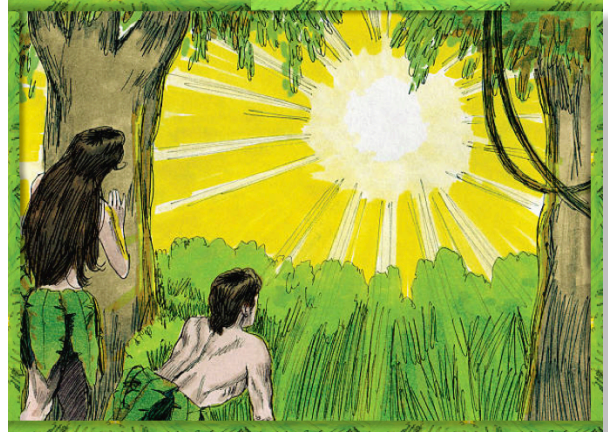


THE ORIGINAL SIN
