CHILDREN OF THE SPRING

"Life is like a spring. When The Lord brings water from the heavens and it infiltrates the ground, and the ground drinks it in—and due to fissures in the rocks and soil, many times the water drains very deep within the layers of the earth. As this water accumulates in size it looks for a place to exit, and works its way through other layers of rock and soil, and through fissures and channels prompted by gravity to emerge in a place where all life can benefit by it. If their prayers are successful, they then set their community there and live again in peace. They will tell their young of the time that the spring dried up, and they had to move, and that many of their ancestors melded with other tribes in other lands, and some died because they could not find another spring. With this, the old tell the young that they must pray to The Father for the spring, and for the water from the heavens to feed it, and give it life.

As the old die off and the time of drought is forgotten, the young focus less and less on their prayers for the spring; for they have had abundant water for all their lives, and have not wanted for water—and they believe that The Lord of the Heavens favors them, and that He will always give them water through the spring.

As their communion with The Father in Heaven weakens, the spring brings less water; but the young do not worry, for the spring has always provided for them; and they now feel entitled that The Lord must bless them with water, because they are favored creatures of the Earth. The prayers slow and communion breaks even further, and the young begin to cry out against The Father of the Spring, and they are angry, for they are the special children of the Earth.

Then the spring stops completely and they begin to die; yet there is one who remembers The Legend from the old ones, and urges the young ones to repent and come back to communion with their Father



of the Spring. The others in their insolence rise up and kill the pure one, because they cannot accept that they must serve anyone—for they are their own gods. So they curse the spring, and cry to the evil ones about to help them; and the evil ones give them some water...for a while.

Then every time the water supply is low, the evil ones demand a higher price, and soon all the people of the spring are slaves of the evil ones, for they think that they cannot live without them...and that The Father of the Spring has abandoned them. So they live in bondage, for they have given up their freedom to the evil ones.
