

THE BASICS OF LOVE

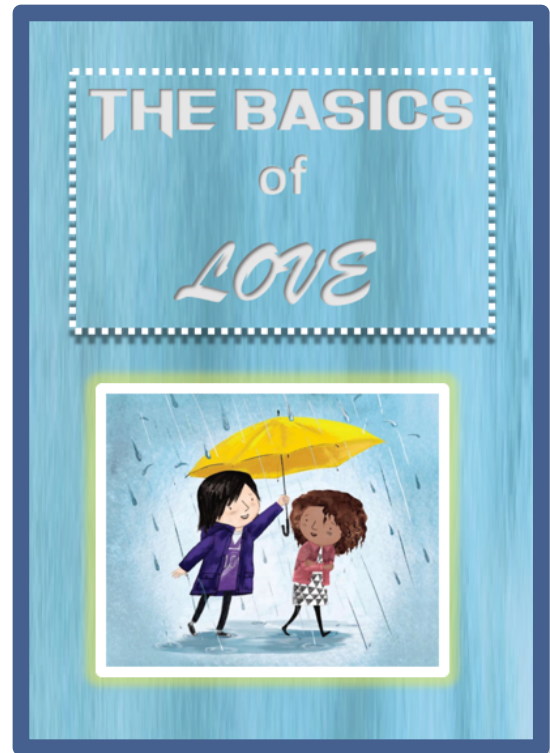
Love can be one of the base emotions, then love can be higher than many realms of Heaven. It can be specific and simple, or it can be as grand as God Himself; and love is universal in that it applies to all creations.

Do you love your job, your cell phone, your siblings, your parents, the Earth, math, science, God? Then you know that true love takes many forms and fashions. There have been societies present and those of the past, that have attempted to classify love, and assign varying words to it with different meanings; but all have fallen short.

Love can range all the way from a passing feeling to a being—a being with actual presence, locality and wholeness. This is what God is...He exists as Love; He is omnipresent, omniscient, and omnipotent, and He knows all and sees and hears all; but at the same time He exists within Love—He is Love.
