## SAMUEL, SAUL, AND SOLOMON

"Now I will show you what happened to King Saul, and I will also show you what happened to King Solomon at the point of their deaths and thereafter. Bear in mind that these two lived under the Old Covenant with Earth and its inhabitants, as opposed to the New Covenant that you and all others who are alive today live under, so their judgment was predicated on a different set of Laws then, but now they exist under the New Covenant as well and all that it espouses applies to them now.

When the New Covenant with the Earth ends in a few years ahead, then there will be a new covenant that will replace the New Covenant—it will be called The Eternal Covenant and it will apply to all who have lived and all who currently live then on the Earth in the time of The Millennium. So bear in mind also, that Saul and Solomon will move from the New Covenant with man, to the Eternal Covenant when it is enacted in the near future.



Had either of these men gone to Hell, they would not be under the New Covenant now; for all condemned are only under the rule of Satan, and he determines all conditions and laws relative to his prisoners and his laws are not breached, for no one wants for pain and suffering worse than they already have. For Saul although he died in his sins, he was not sufficiently wicked to justify an eternity in Hell, so he was judged at the point of physical death to be consistent with a realm of correction and he was sent there after his time in Limbo, or like you would consider suspended animation like sleep.

Jesus came to all in Limbo directly after His body died on the cross, and He moved all those who were there to their appropriate realm based on the New Covenant—for now the New Covenant ruled all living and dead outside Hell. Saul was counselled by Jesus and he was very grateful that Jesus had given His life that all might be saved, for if Saul would have been judged solely by the Old Covenant, he would have gone to a realm of Hell. Thus Jesus spoke, and Saul went to a moderate level of Purgatory and stayed there for quite some time until he was completely purified. Saul is now in Heaven and works diligently to improve his lot so that he may see God in the era's ahead. He is fully repentant and holy and seeks to please God in all that he does.

King Solomon's story in similar, he did not pursue righteousness, holiness, and purity, in the complete way that God had wished for such an important individual in God's Plan; and even though Solomon was blessed mightily because of his father's righteousness through penance, he did not fully recognize the Justice and Love of God, so in many ways he failed. However as Solomon grew older he recognized more and more the importance of love, forgiveness, humility, contrition, fidelity, holiness, and righteousness, and he spent many hours dwelling on these aspects of his life. As he became bored with the material world and all that it had to offer, he reached out to the mystical, and through this he found The True God; however along this path he stumbled and wandered from righteousness...and while when he died he was fully with God, he still had some stains on his soul, so Jesus spoke him to one of the realms of correction as well.....Purgatory.



Through his years in Purgatory which was a relatively short stay, he became a model example of human righteousness, holiness, and purity; and today he gains stature and grows to be more like God rapidly and God is very pleased with him and blesses him mightily. Those who attain the higher levels of Heaven will harken him.
