## WHY SATAN-TO EARTH

"This is a good question My son and a very involved one...but I will give you a short answer to edify all who are suffering or who have suffered while on Earth.

When Lucifer sinned, he alleged that God had produced him and had God not made him as he was with all the possibilities and probabilities...that he would have had no capacity for sin, and therefore never would have committed a sin. God explained that this is the Perfection of Love, where one has opportunity to push love away or taint love... but one freely chooses not...yet fully embraces love as a result of choices freely made. Lucifer denied the validity of this rationale and accused God of being weak in love, and that true strength would have maintained complete control and not allowed subservient creations to rebel and disrespect the higher one. God told him after much debate, that the strength in love is true perfection...and the highest state of being, and that the tradeoff of 'control elements' with 'love elements' was not only justified, but necessary for perfection.

The debate went on for a long time and Satan and his followers so polluted the beauty, solemnity, and peace in Heaven, that God finally knew that He would have to extricate all sin and imperfection in order to preserve Heaven as it needed to be in His Perfect Plan.
