
## LAWS AND OBEDIENCE

"Do you think that I have abandoned My people? Do you think that the coming judgment is too harsh? Do you think that the sin by Adam and Eve does not justify all the years of punishment and terror for those who have failed and gone to Hell? Do you think that a loving and compassionate Creator would not allow the pain and suffering of His creations who do not live by His Laws? Does it seem as though minor, non-malicious breaches of His Laws should be forgiven and not punished? Does the entire system of the human race from birth to death, seem punitive and transitory?

These are all good questions, and these questions have been asked by humans since the time of the first breach of God's Law. He created Earth to be a perfect setting for Adam and Eve, yet evil did exist in the form of Satan and given the Covenant with Satan, there were also other physical factors involved with the Covenant such as the Tree of 'Knowledge' that Adam was told could not be touched or eaten from. Adam knew that this was a non-negotiable law and that if he were to break that law that he would die a spiritual death.
